BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Vivekananda Satavarshiki Mahavidyalaya was established in the year 1964 in commemoration of birth centenary of Swami Vivekananda. It was an outcome of a tremendous moral and financial support and farsightedness of some of the most sincere and enlightened local people. The avowed purpose was to cater to the need of higher education among the poor and less privileged students, particularly the girls residing in the backward rural areas of Jhargram district. Starting its journey with approximately 50 students of arts stream, 5 teaching and 2 non-teaching staff members in two rooms of a local high school, it now has its own sprawling campus over 18.86 acres of land acquired on lease from the State Government. Our college presently accommodates more than 1500 students enrolled in Arts, Science and Commerce streams, 51 teaching (Part-time, guest teachers included), 15 non-teaching staff members and 1 Librarian, who strive together to ensure that Vivekananda Satavarshiki Mahavidyalaya emerges as one of the best performing colleges in this region.

The college is situated amidst quiet natural surroundings in a small town called Manikpara, located between Kharagpur and Jhargram, just 2.5 km away from NH-6 and about 3.5 km from the nearest Railway Station, Sardiha on Kharagpur – Tatanagar Railway line. Our college campus is surrounded by extensive greenery, providing the perfect ambiance that is conducive for a healthy mind and body. It has been providing an opportunity for higher education in Arts, Science and Commerce streams to the first generation learners of the extensive tribal belt of Jhargram (previously Paschim Medinipur) district since many years. Some of our students have performed remarkably well at the University exams, S.S.C. exams and NET. We feel proud of the fact that some of them are engaged as part-time lecturers in our college, a tradition we would like to continue in future with sincerity and confidence.

Since its inception, the college was affiliated to the University of Calcutta with Arts in intermediate and B.A. (Pass) with Bengali, English, Political Science, Philosophy, Economics, and Sanskrit as elective subjects. B.Sc. (Pass) Course was introduced in 1995 with Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics. From the academic session 1985-86 all the Colleges of undivided Midnapore district came under the newly established Vidyasagar University. So, Vivekananda Satavarshiki Mahavidyalaya also got affiliation of Vidyasagar University. Subsequently, our institution has introduced Honours Courses in Bengali (1990), Economics (1991), History (1999), Political Science (1999), Philosophy (2002), Mathematics (2003), Physics (2004), English

(2005), Sanskrit (2005), Chemistry (2008), Geography (2011), Accountancy (2011), Santali (2012) B. Com. General Course was introduced in the year 2001 and Physical Education as elective subject in general course in 2006.

The role of education towards the advancement of a society is of supreme importance. Empowering the poor and academically backward people of Manikpara and adjoining areas was the sole aim and objective of founding this College. In spite of the fact that our College faced different obstacles like financial crunch, lack of permanent posts, difficult transport and communication, it could still become functional towards delivering quality education to students, irrespective of their caste, creed, religion, gender or financial status of the students. At present, the College offers degree courses in 13 (thirteen) honours subjects and 14 (fourteen) general subjects.

COURSES OF STUDY

This college offers Under Graduate courses both in Honours (Core Course) and General (Program) courses. Under Graduate courses are offered in three faculties' viz. Science, Arts and commerce.

UNDER GRADUATE COURSES (Under CBCS System)

The college offers the following three year undergraduate courses in Arts, Science and Commerce.

- a. Degree Honours and General in Arts.
 - b. Degree Honours and General in Science.
 - c. Degree Honours and General in Commerce.
- **3-year (6 Semester) B.Sc. (Core/Honours) courses** in Five Science subjects such as **Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Geography and Economics** are offered to the students passing the H.S. or equivalent examination with requisite marks and combinations.
- **3-year B.A. (6 Semester) (Core/Honours) courses** in Four Languages such as **Bengali, English, Sanskrit and Santali** are offered to the students passing H.S. or equivalent examinations with requisite marks and combination.
- **3-years B.A. (6 Semester) (Core/Honours) courses** in Three Arts subjects such as **History, Political Science and Philosophy** are offered to the students passing H.S. or equivalent examinations with requisite marks and combination.
- **3-years B.Com (6 Semester) (Core/Honours) courses** in **Accounting and Finance** are offered to the students passing H.S. or equivalent examinations

with requisite marks and combination.

- **3-year B.Sc. (6 Semester) (General/core program and combination) in Science Stream** is offered to the students passing H.S. or equivalent examinations in the following Six subjects **Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Geography, Economics, Nutrition and Computer Science.**
- **3-year B.A. (6 Semester) (General/core program and combination)** is offered to the students passing H.S. or equivalent examinations examinations in the following Eight subjects as **Bengali, English, Sanskrit, Santali, History, Political Science, Philosophy, Music, Education, NCC, NSS and Physical Education.**
- **3-years B.Com (6 Semester) (General/core program and combination) courses** in **Accounting and Finance** are offered to the students passing H.S. or equivalent examinations with requisite marks and combination.

STRUCTURE OF THE COURSE

(Under CBCS System for Academic Session: 2018-2019)

According to Draft Regulation of CBCS Pattern relating to UG course of studies and examinations of Vidyasagar University]

All the courses are studied under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) where students can not only learn core subjects but also explore additional avenues of learning beyond the core subjects for holistic development of an individual. In this system a student has a flexibility to learn of their own choice.

The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) have following facilities:

- Here the course curriculum is learner centric,
- With their domain centric knowledge, students are encouraged to inter-disciplinary knowledge,
- It helps a student to promote mobility,
- continuous evaluation system helps students to optimizing learning,
- This improves employability of students.

Duration of the Course:

- The duration of the Programme is **Six (06) consecutive semesters of six months each.**
- A candidate shall have to clear all the Semesters within consecutive **five years** from the academic year of his/her first admission to the college.

Courses under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS):

Under the design of "Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)" the curriculum has been moulded into three tier structure with following types of courses to be offered:

(a) Core Course (CC): A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as core requirement, is termed as a Core Course. For Honours courses there will be **14** core courses and for General courses, there will be **12** core courses.

(b) Elective Course: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline / subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline / subject/ domain or nurtures the candidates proficiency/ skill is called elective Course.

• **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) course:** Elective courses which may be offered by the main discipline / subjects of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective (DSE). For Honours and General Course 4 DSE courses are to taken out of a pool given for the different semester courses. Further it may include an elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study / support study to a project work and a candidate can study such a course called dissertation / Project on his or her own choice with an advisory support by a teacher / faculty member.

• **Generic Elective (GE) Course:** An elective course chosen generally from a non-related discipline / subjects, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic Elective. A core course offered in a discipline / subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/ subject and vice-versa and as such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective. For Honours course 4(four) Generic Elective Courses are to be taken from the list of Generic Elective papers and for General courses (only for B/A/B Com), 2(two) Generic Elective are to be taken from the list of Generic Elective Papers.

a) **Ability Enhancement Course (AEC):** The Ability Enhancement Course

(AEC) may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Course (SEC).

1. **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC):** AECC elective courses

are the courses which are based upon the contents lead to knowledge enhancement.

i) English /MIL, ii) Environmental Studies. These are mandatory for both Honours and General Courses. These courses will generally be of **2** credits except environmental studies which are of **4** credits. AECC Core: AECC Core courses are meant for only General (BA/B Com) courses. These courses will generally be of **6** credit courses.

2. **Skill Enhancement Course (SEC):** These courses may be chosen from a

pool of courses designed to provide value based and/or skill - based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands on training/ field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life skills in hands on mode so as to increase their employability. Minimum **2** for Honours and **4** for General courses are to be taken.

Course structure:

- Each Honours Course shall be of **142** credits, to be studied in six **(06)** semesters.
- Each General Course shall be of **122** credits, to be studied in Six **(06)** semesters.

Core Course (CC), Discipline Specific Elective (DSE), Generic Elective(GE) courses are of **6 (six)** credit each and Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) & Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) are of **2 (two)** credits each excluding Environmental Studies (ENVS) which is of **4 (four)** credits.

- An undergraduate Degree with Honours in Arts /Science/ Commerce shall be awarded if a student completes 14 core courses/papers in that discipline, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 4 courses/papers from a list of Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) and 4 courses/papers from a list of Generic Elective(GE) papers, respectively.
- An undergraduate General Degree in Science shall be awarded if a student completes 12 core courses/papers (4 core papers each in three discipline of choice) , 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses(AECC), 4 skill Enhancement Courses(SEC) and 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) papers based on three discipline of choice selected above, respectively.
- An undergraduate General Degree in Arts/Commerce shall be awarded if a student completes 12 Core Courses (4 core papers each in two discipline of choice, 2 core papers each in English and MIL respectively), 2 Ability Enhancement compulsory Course (AECC), 4 Skill Enhancement Course (SEC), 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) papers based on the two discipline of choice selected above respectively, and 2 papers from the Generic Elective (GE).

The following are the University examination patterns for these courses.

There are two way of assessment in each semester.

- **Internal Assessment (IA):** 20% marks of the each paper will be evaluated by the corresponding department in each semester. These marks will be evaluated based on two internal assessment and class attendance. Here 5 marks are assigned to each paper for class attendance and remaining for internal assessment.
- **End Semester Examination (ESE):** This is the final examination; a candidate has to appear to the prescribed centre by the university at the end of the semester. 80% marks of the any paper will be evaluated in this examination.

At the time of result publication these two marks will be combined and that will be converted to the Semester Grade point (SGPA).

SGPA: Semester Grade point average (SGPA) is evaluated after each semester. This will be computed in each semester as per the following formula:

$$SGPA = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^n C_i G_i}{\sum_{i=1}^n C_i}$$

C_i = The number of credits allotted for particular course.

G_i = This is the Grade points corresponding to the grade awarded for the course.

$i = 1, 2, \dots, n$ represent the number of course in which a student is registered in the concerned semester. The SGPA is rounded off to two decimal places.

CGPA: Cumulative Grade point average (SGPA) is evaluated after all semester. This will be computed in each semester as per the following formula:

$$CGPA = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^n C_i S_i}{\sum_{i=1}^n C_i}$$

C_i = The total credits of the corresponding semesters.

S_i = The SGPA of the corresponding semesters.

$i = 1, 2, \dots, n$ represent the number of the course in which a student is registered in the concerned semester. The CGPA is rounded off to two decimal places.

RESERVATION OF SEATS

- Rules for Category-wise Reservation of seats follow the rules mentioned in **West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in admission) Act, 2013.**
- **28% seats (22% for SC and 6% for ST) and 17% seats (10% for OBC-A and 7% for OBC-B)** in each subject shall be kept reserved for those category students who will be eligible for admission. If the number of SC/ST candidates falls short of the quota for them, the candidates of general category may fill up the vacancies after observing necessary procedures.
- **3% of the seats** shall be reserved for physically handicapped candidates having not less than 40% disabilities subject to production of medical certificates from appropriate authorities.

ADMISSION RULES AND PROCEDURE

General Admission Rules

- All applications must be done online through the college admission portal <http://vsmonline.in> or through the link provided in college website <http://www.vsm.org.in>. No physical form will be accepted in the college.

- Application fees and admission fees are to be paid through banks by online or offline means. No cash transaction will be made in college premises.

- Admission to the degree course in this college is made on merit basis in terms of marks obtained in H.S. or equivalent (10+2) examination conducted by any Council / Board recognized by the University– as per university guidelines. For admission to Honours courses, Merit Point is to be calculated by adding 10% of the total marks obtained in the 'Best five' subjects and the marks obtained in the subject in which the admission in Honours course is sought. Merit Point for admission to General Course is to be calculated by adding the marks obtained in 'Best five' subjects.

- All courses are incorporated under CBCS (Choice Based Credit System). The courses and evaluation process will be as per Semester basis.

- Any candidate seeking admission to any Honours Course, must secure at least 45% in the aggregate (to be calculated by adding the marks obtained in 'Best Five' subjects) or 50% marks in the concerned subject or related subject in the last qualifying examination. All candidates passed in H.S. or equivalent (10+2) examinations are eligible to apply for General Course.

- Candidates passing the H.S. or equivalent examinations in the years 2018, 2019 and 2020 are normally eligible to apply. If the candidate admitted earlier in the college but unsuccessful & lost all chances in Part- I, those candidates may be permitted for admission into 1st semester (session 2020-2021) after taking Special permission from university authority (as for example, the student who passed HS in 2017 and unsuccessful in 2018 & 2019, he / she may be permitted after taking special permission for admission. Follow the related notices in the notice section of the website for further information.

- Admission to the courses (Hons. & Gen) will be done strictly on merit basis and subject to availability of seats as per reservation.

- Students have to attend personally for counseling on the specified dates to confirm their seats for admission.

- Students willing to take Physical Education as pass combination need to undergo for an admission test.
- All admissions are provisional. Admission will be cancelled if any mistake or suppression of facts is detected afterwards. In this regard the decision of the college authority will be final.
- Discipline of the college should be maintained strictly. On admission, each and every student has to abide by the rules and regulations imposed by the college authorities and the affiliating bodies from time to time.

Disclaimer: In view of the currently ongoing Covid-19 pandemic, admission rules are subject to change. College will provide complete guidelines to the students (to be uploaded in the website) about admission procedure as per directives sent by the State Government.

REGISTRATION

After admission every student is required to get himself/herself registered with the Vidyasagar University with the subjects taken in as per UG Guidelines. Without Registration the candidature of the admitted students will be cancelled.

NATIONAL ACADEMIC DEPOSITORY (NAD) AND DIGILOCKER

NAD allows lodging of Academic awards in a digital format, maintaining the integrity of access to the database and of the awards lodged in the database. It allows students to retrieve their lodged academic awards at any time. In addition to ensuring authenticity, integrity and confidentiality of the digital database of academic awards, NAD would be an effective deterrence to fake and forged paper certificates. Further, it would reduce a lot of administrative efforts.

It is compulsory for every student has to enroll himself in the **NAD** <https://nad.ndml.in/NAD/newStudentRegistrationScreen.html> and **DigiLocker** (<https://accounts.digitallocker.gov.in/signup>) after the university registration is done

failing which he/she will be unable to access his/her mark sheet/ certificates of passing university examination. This is mandatory for all students.

DigiLocker (<https://nad.digitallocker.gov.in/>) and NAD are initiatives of Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) and Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) respectively. The concept of National Academic Depository (NAD) is born out of an initiative by MHRD to provide a 24X7 online depository to Academic institutions to store and publish their academic awards. The digital depository not only ensures easy access to and retrieval of an academic award but also validates and guarantees its authenticity and safe storage.

It aspires to make the vision of Digital Academic awards for every Indian a reality.

Features of DigiLocker

Operates in fully online mode

Allows Academic Institutions to lodge Academic Awards in digital format and maintains the integrity of the awards

Allows Students to retrieve their lodged academic awards at any time

Allows Employers and other persons (with consent of the concerned Student) to verify the authenticity of any Academic Award

EXAMINATION RULES

Each academic year shall have two Semesters. In each semester, there shall be two types of examinations: Internal Assessment (IA) and End Semester Examination (ESE).

Internal Assessment:

All the internal continuous assessment will be conducted by the internal teacher of the respective Department. In each semester there will be two internal assessments for each paper.

End Semester Examination (ESE):

End Semester Examination will be conducted by the university at the end of the semester.

Marks obtained in the internal assessment will be clubbed with marks obtained in the End Semester Examination and class attendance before awarding the grade. For each 6-credit course, there are total 75 marks and for each 2-credit course there are total 50 marks. Out of these 20% will be evaluated from Internal Assessment and Class Attendance. 80% will be evaluated from End Semester Examination.

Disclaimer: In view of the currently ongoing Covid pandemic all examination rules are subject to change. College will provide complete guidelines to the students before all examinations as per directives sent by Vidyasagar University.

GENERAL RULES

- Tuition fees for each month must be paid within 10th of the respective month, otherwise a fine Rs. 5/ will be charged for each month.
- Caution money will be refunded after a student completes the course (3 Years 6 Semester CBCS course) on production of the caution money receipt. If the caution money is not withdrawn within 3 months of passing out, it will be forfeited automatically.
- Students shall have to pay any fee omitted here or imposed later on by the college.
- Students must be punctual and regular in attending classes.
- Students must consult the College Notice board every day, failing which the College authority will not be responsible for any inconvenience faced by them
- Students are required to attend all extra-curricular activities organized by the institution.

DISCIPLINE

- Admission to the college binds a student to observe college rules and all directives that may be issued from time to time by College authority.
- Loitering and lounging in the corridors before the office and the library is strictly prohibited.
- Students must not unnecessarily assemble before the Principal's Room, Staff Room, Office, Library Room and Class rooms.
- Students must also regularly see the college Notice Board for various information.
- The students of 1st semester must fill in the University Registration form (availability of form will be notified on the notice board) positively within otherwise the college will bear no responsibility in this regard.

- Students must attend more than 75% lectures delivered in each subject. If a student does not attend 60% of lectures delivered, he will become discollegiate i.e. shall become ineligible to appear at the University Examination.
- Ragging in any form is prohibited in the college campus. If an incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain and if his explanations are not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him from the institution.
- Use of mobile phones inside the class-rooms is strictly prohibited.
- Disciplinary matters will be looked after by the Academic Subcommittee of the College
- Students shall take proper care of the college furniture and must not properly at its premises and must not spoil or cause any deliberate damage or tamper with the College property, furniture, fittings etc.
- Students shall leave their bicycles, scooters or motorcycle in the shed provided for this purpose. No bicycles, scooters or motorcycles shall be parked in any other part of the College premises.
- Passing Improper comments about anybody and eve teasing of all forms are strictly prohibited.

IDENTITY CARD

After admission to the College each student is entitled to get an identity card signed by the Principal and it is a proof of his/her status as a student of this College. Students are required to bring their identity card with them to College and produce it as and when necessary. Loss of identity card must be reported immediately to the office and will be replaced on payment of charges for the same. In case of transfer or withdrawal from the college, the card must be surrendered at the College office.

LIBRARY

The library was established way back in the year 1964 with the inception of the college with some books mostly obtained through donations from the founder members. The library is now decorated with spacious shelving area, two separate reading rooms for students and teachers, a reference section and a server room. The

whole library is secured with the CCTV surveillance. The library has a vast collection of both text books and reference books, print and online journals and newspapers which help in teaching and learning process of the faculty members and the students of our college. The library has a well designed website and online catalog (OPAC) which facilitates easy access to its collection. The students of 1st semester can apply for the library membership card after completion of their university registration. In case of 2nd and 3rd semester students, library card will be renewed after they are provisionally admitted to the college. All the students are required to bring one copy of their recent photographs (passport size) along with the fee receipt while applying for library membership. Students can borrow three books at a time for a period of fifteen days. A late fine of fifty paise per day will be levied after the due date. Students are requested to go through and abide by all the rules and regulations which are displayed at library notice board.

Disclaimer: During pandemic period library will not be able to provide physical library services like membership cards, circulation of books etc. Instead we will try provide virtual library services through online collection through library website and on-demand information services through personal communication.

COMPLIANCE TO ANTI-RAGGING CELL

Students Aid Fund

Student Welfare Committee provides some financial assistance to needy students during filling up of forms for University Examinations from their student – aid-fund. Student Welfare Committee invites applications from the students. Students are required to produce authenticated documents on Guardians income while applying for this aid. The financial assistance is provided to the poor students short-listed by the Student Welfare Committee upon verification of the documents. Stipend for SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B students:

students are awarded from the B.C.W. department. Students are required to collect forms from B.C.W. department, Jhargram and submit the duly filled in form to BCW Deptt, Jhargram after getting it verified from the college authorities.

Kanyashree:

Kanyashree Prakalpa is a unique welfare scheme introduced by the Government of West Bengal which seeks to improve the status and wellbeing of girls, especially those from socio-economically disadvantaged families through Conditional Cash Transfers. Aikyashree scholarship is provided by the West Bengal Minorities Development and Finance Corporation (WBMDFC) for the meritorious students belonging to the minority communities (Buddhists, Christians, Jains, Muslims, Parsis, and Sikhs) coming from low income backgrounds of West Bengal.

Nabanna scholarship seeks to provide financial assistance to meritorious students of West Bengal every year under the Chief Minister's Relief Fund. Sitaram Jindal Scholarship is provided by the Sitaram Jindal Foundation—a charitable organization in Bangalore—every year to the meritorious and economically weak students all over India. Among others, students pursuing graduation can voluntarily apply for the scholarship.

Priyambada-Birla

The Priyamvada Birla Scholarship is funded by the Madhav Prasad Priyamvada Birla Apex Charitable Trust. The scholarship is meant for meritorious students from low income backgrounds pursuing undergraduate courses in recognized colleges and institutions in West Bengal.

Swami Vivekananda Merit cum Means Scholarship

Swami Vivekananda Merit cum Means Scholarship is provided by the Government of West Bengal for assisting the meritorious students belonging to economically backward families. Among others, the scholarship is open for students pursuing undergraduate courses in regular mode.

Apart from the above scholarships, meritorious students coming from economically weaker backgrounds can apply for the national scholarship through the National Scholarship Portal as well as minority scholarships.

Our college provides active help-desk facilities to the enrolled students willing to apply for all the above scholarships.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The NSS units of V.S. Mahavidyalaya have started their journey in the early 90's and have remained very successful in pursuing its activities till now. College has four N.S.S. units with four program officers as their monitoring heads. The basic objectives of N.S.S. are to encourage students for involvement in social welfare activities, to develop leadership qualities among the students and instill in them the spirit of amity and sense of community integration.

The N.S.S. units have a very successful record of participation and winning awards at the various National and International level programs. NATIONAL CADET CORPS (N.C.C.)

N.C.C. Companies for Boys and Girls of the college are under 25 Bengal Bn N.C.C. One A.N.O is in-charge of this Unit. Students are required to apply in prescribed form for enrolment as NCC cadet in the 1st year class and get the enrolment renewed in the 2nd year and 3rd year classes. The basic aim of N.C.C is to develop leadership qualities, sense of discipline, sense of devotion for national and social cause etc.

N.C.C. Unit of the college is one of the best in the state. Our cadets have made their presence felt at State and National levels and have already won 06 Governors medals.

N.C.C. cadets get chance to participate in number of activities such as camps at different parts of the country, expeditions to inculcate the spirit of adventure, Republic Day parades in Kolkata and New Delhi. State and Central Governments give a number of incentives to N.C.C. cadets both in academic and employment fronts. N.C.C cadets having 'C' Certificates are given preference by Armed forces, B.S.F, C.R.P.F, C.I.S.F, I.T.B.P., West Bengal Police etc. during their recruitment process and many of our cadets have joined these forces from this institution.

Students are therefore advised to join N.C.C. as cadet and develop the skills required to face the challenges lying ahead with confidence.

COLLEGE HEALTH CARE UNIT

College has a health care unit to regularly check up the health of the students. College provided FIRST AID treatment to the students. The Health Unit organizes several health camps, awareness campaigns, etc. periodically in the college campus. There is a primary Health Centre within 2 KM from our place. We refer students if necessary.

STUDENTS UNION/COUNCIL

As per Government rules and the University statute, the college has a students' union. The members of this union are elected annually from and by the students of this College. The students' union takes the responsibility of organizing Fresher's Welcome for newly admitted students, common room activities, and cultural programmes of this College etc. Every year the Annual Magazine of the College is also published under the enthusiastic participation of the students' union of this College.

HOSTEL

There are two separate hostels of this college, one for Boys and other for Girls.

Boys' Hostel

The college Boys' Hostel is offered to the meritorious and poor students according to the distance to the college from their home. The students need to apply for the Hostel at the time of admission. The students can continue after renewal of their candidature every semester. It is compulsory for all students to vacate their hostel seats after completion of the course. This period will not be extended under any circumstances.

Girls' Hostel

Girls' Hostel is meant for regular female students of this college. Boarders must obey the rules and regulations which the Principal of the college or the Superintendent of the hostel may enforce from time to time. The students need to apply for the Hostel at the time of admission. The students can continue after renewal of their candidature every semester. It is compulsory for all students to vacate their hostel seats after completion of the course. This period will not be extended under any circumstances.

Hostel Admission Criteria

Regular students of V.S. Mahavidyalaya are eligible for admission to these hostels. Admission will be for a full university session/semester. Application for admission to the hostel should be submitted to the college/hostel office in a prescribed form within a fixed date, to be notified by college/hostel office. Admission to the hostel as boarder is strictly done on the basis of distance and merit. Each application should be accompanied by-

- i. Certificates of good conduct from the superintendent of hostel last resided/ from the Head of the institution last attended/ a respectable person of the locality.
- ii. Self attested copy of the mark sheet of the last examination passed.
- iii. Distance certificate from M. L. A./Gram Panchayat/ S. D. O./ B. D. O./ Chairman of Municipality.
- iv. ST students can avail accommodation at Central boys ST hostel for which they will have to apply directly to B.C.W.D. at Jhargram.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

Students leaving the college after successful completion of their studies are required to enroll their names in the college alumni association and extend their helping hand for the development of the institution.

REMEDIAL COACHING CLASSES

Earlier there was a provision of Remedial Coaching for the S.C. / S.T. / O.B.C. students of the College with financial assistance from U.G.C. Since the year 2009, students from General category were also allowed to benefit from this scheme. Although this scheme is currently not operational due to lack of financial assistance from UGC, our teachers, on their own initiative, organize remedial classes for the slow learners and also for those who need to clear their back papers.

CAREER COUNSELING CELL

College has a career counseling cell being run with financial assistance from U.G.C. It provides information and guidance regarding the future career planning of the students. Lately, it has facilitated the initiation of three value added courses namely: tailoring, jewelry design, and computer applications in the college under the Utkarsh Bangla initiative of the Government of West Bengal to which around 450 aspirants in total have enrolled. Moreover, the career counselling cell has a significant track record of organizing occasional seminars and workshops for motivating the students and providing the much required guidance in their areas of interest.

COMPUTER LAB

The college has a equipped computer laboratories with internet connection to aid to the students in their various academic activities.

CANTEEN

College has a well equipped canteen to cater to the needs of the students and the staff members with good quality of foods at a reasonable rate.

PERIODICAL PARENT-TEACHER MEET

A parent-teacher meeting is a short meeting that takes place in a regular interval usually after every semester between the parents and teachers of the concerned departments to discuss the progress and find solutions to academic or behavioral problems of a student. Feedback from the parents are taken for improvements in academic services.

OTHER FACILITIES

1. Gymnasium : Students and staff members can use the Gymnasium from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m.
2. U.G.C. network resource centre at Library provides access to e-books and e-journals.
3. Separate common rooms for boys and girls with provisions for T.V. sets & some indoor games.
4. Facilities for Football, Volleyball, Badminton, Cricket, Table Tennis are available.
5. Internet access at library for academic purpose.
