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ABOUT THE COLLEGE

“All the wealth of the world cannot help one little Indian village if the people are not taught to help themselves. Our work should be mainly educational, both moral and intellectual.”

-Swami Vivekananda's letter to Swami Suddhananda, 11th July 1897, Almora.

Vivekananda Satavarshiki Mahavidyalaya was established in the year 1964 in commemoration of birth centenary of Swami Vivekananda. It was an outcome of a tremendous moral and financial support and farsightedness of some of the most sincere and enlightened local people. The college is situated amidst quiet natural surroundings in a small town called Manikpara, located between Kharagpur and Jhargram, 2.5 km from NH6 and 3.5 km from the nearest railway station Sardiha on Kharagpur-Tatanagar Railway line. The college boasts of a sprawling campus over 18.86 acres of land acquired on lease from the State Government, accomodating more than 1500 students enrolled in Arts, Science and Commerce streams, 58 teaching including full-time and SACTs (State Aided College Teacher), 15 non-teaching staff members and 1 Librarian, who strive together to ensure that the College emerges as one of the best performing colleges in this region. At present, the College offers degree courses in 13 honours subjects and 14 general subjects.

Vivekananda Satavarshiki Mahavidyalaya, has since its inception in 1964, tried to integrate itself as not only an educational institution to the relatively backward hamlet of Manikpara, but as a site of community empowerment through mentorship and guidance in various ways. Goaded with serious challenges of transport, the college becomes a vital point of access to higher education for the people of the Manikpara village and other smaller villages in the surroundings. Initially, the college was affiliated to the University of Calcutta with Arts in intermediate and B.A. (Pass) with Bengali, English, Political Science, Philosophy, Economics, and Sanskrit as elective subjects. B.Sc. (Pass) Course was introduced in 1995 with Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics. From the academic session 1985-86, Vivekananda Satavarshiki Mahavidyalaya like all the other Colleges of undivided Midnapore district got affiliation of the newly established Vidyasagar University. Subsequently, the institution has introduced Honours Courses in Bengali (1990), Economics (1991), History (1999), Political Science (1999), Philosophy (2002), Mathematics (2003), Physics (2004), English (2005), Sanskrit (2005), Chemistry (2008), Geography (2011), Accountancy (2011), Santali (2012). B. Com. General Course was introduced in the year 2001 and Physical Education as elective subject in general course in 2006.

In a world affected by serious climate change concerns, the college adopts it as a vision to present itself as a green campus to spread awareness amongst the local inhabitants about a possible future in which climate change could be answered by local solutions where educational institutions and inhabitants become equal stakeholders. With post-COVID scenario bringing up newer challenges for the higher education scenario in this country, Vivekananda's perception of an education that is at once collective and centred on the community motivates us for a world fraught with greater realities. In future times, V.S. Mahavidyalaya hopes to be the site of collective active association that secures colourful multicultural reality of the Jhargram district, through education and empowerment.

PREAMBLE

UGC has developed the *Curriculum & Credit Framework for UG Programmes (CCFUP)* based on NEP notified by government of India (29th July 2020). Department of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal had issued directives for implementation of CCFUP on 17 March, 2023 to all State Universities from the forthcoming session. Vidyasagar University has designed new Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes in Semester mode for various disciplines and recommended for its implementation from the Academic Session 2023-2024. This Curriculum emphasizes on continuous learning and evaluation, holistic education by enabling students to learn inter/multidisciplinary and Value-Added courses through a 3- Year or 4-Year Undergraduate programmes with flexible degree having multiple entry and exit options. Under this framework, a student will get ample opportunity to accumulate credits by opting for Major Courses, Minor Courses, Multidisciplinary Courses, Ability Enhancement Courses, Skill Enhancement Courses and Value-Added Courses under various disciplines. CCFUP programme aims to strengthen the academic potential of the student by providing flexibility in the choice of courses offered beyond the framework of the respective disciplines of study. Students will choose major, minor, multidisciplinary and other courses at the time of their admission. Our college offers both the 3-year and 4-year undergraduate programmes based on CCFUP structures in the disciplines of Science, Arts and Commerce.

1. CCFUP: Scope and Applications

(i) The Undergraduate Academic Programmes governed by these CCFUP Regulations of Vidyasagar University shall be with multiple entry and exit options with appropriate Certifications/ Diplomas/ Degrees as follows:

- a) Bachelor's Certificate in a Discipline upon the successful completion of the First Year (Two Semesters).
- b) Bachelor's Diploma in a Discipline upon the successful completion of the Second Year (Four Semesters).
- c) Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline upon the successful completion of the Third Year (Six Semesters).
- d) Bachelor's Degree with Honours / Honours with Research (UG Degree with Hons. / Research) in a Discipline upon the successful completion of the Four years (Eight Semesters).

2. Course and Credit Structure Regulations under CCFUP

(i) MAJOR COURSE (MJ): Major discipline is the discipline or subject of main focus and the degree will be awarded in that discipline.

- Each major course shall be of 4 credits
- Minimum credits required from major discipline/s for a programme shall be - 80 credits for 4-year hons. / hons. with research programme - 60 credits for 3-year multidisciplinary studies programme
- Major course can be of any subject chosen from the listed programmes in the following section)

(ii) MINOR COURSE (MI): Minor discipline/s to be opted from the bunch/ group of subjects assigned to a particular programme.

- Each Minor course shall be of 4 credits
- Minimum credits required from Minor discipline/s for a programme shall be - 32 credits to be studied for 4-year Hons. / Hons. with Research programme - 24 credits to be studied for 3-year Multidisciplinary Studies programme

(iii) MULTIDISCIPLINARY COURSES (MDC): A multidisciplinary course is an option to explore courses from other disciplines of interest beyond the choices students make in major courses.

- Three (03) courses of 3 Credits each to be studied from 1st to 3rd semesters.
- Students must not select MDC courses from their Major subject.
- Multidisciplinary Courses are common for all programmes and semester specific.

(iv) ABILITY ENHANCEMENT COURSES (AEC): These are generic courses aimed to enhance skills in communication and local languages.

- Four (04) AEC courses shall be of 2 credits each.
- One (01) AEC course is to be taken in each Semester upto 4th Semesters
- Communicative English is compulsory course for all students to improve the communication abilities.
- Modern Indian Language (MIL) e.g. Bengali/Hindi/Sanskrit/Santali to be chosen as per the curriculum.

(v) SKILL ENHANCEMENT COURSES (SEC): These courses are aimed at imparting practical skills, hands-on training, soft skills, etc., to enhance the employability of students.

- The SECs shall be purely practical/project /hands-on training-based course

- Three (03) SEC courses shall be of 3 credits each and to be studied in 1st to 3rd Semesters
- One (01) SEC course in each semester is to be studied from 1st to 3rd Semesters.
- College authority may designate Course Coordinator for SEC for each discipline.
- Evaluation of Training, assignment, project etc. shall be conducted at the College level.
- Semester end practical / project evaluation shall be conducted by University nominated External Examiner along with Internal examiner/ Course Coordinator for SEC.
- Discipline specific list of SEC courses have been provided in the respective curriculum.

(vi) VALUE ADDED COURSES (VAC): Value added interdisciplinary courses are to enhance the standard of the students beyond specified academic curriculum. Two (02) VAC courses (common for all programmes) to be selected from below:

- For Semester-I (01 compulsory paper) a. Environmental Studies (ENVS)
- For Semester-II (01 paper to be selected) a. Human Rights b. Yoga and Wellness c. Disaster Management

(vii) INTERNSHIP/APPRENTICESHIP/COMMUNITY SERVICES/ ENTREPRENEURSHIP

- Students will be provided with opportunities for Internship /Apprenticeship/ Entrepreneurship/
- Community Services with nearby locality, local bodies, local industry, business organizations,
- health and allied areas. It shall be a short - term engagement of Four (04) weeks in a
- suitable organization or hands on training in order to gain work experience.

6. Eligibility for Admission to undergraduate programmes

A. General admission criteria - applicable for UG Admission from the session 2024-25 onwards with respect to introduction of CCFUP are as follows:

1. Candidate **passing Higher Secondary Examination (10+2)** conducted by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or any other equivalent board/council (as per Registered Board/ Council lists (**Annexure-5**) of Vidyasagar University) are eligible for admission in 4-Year Bachelor's degree (Hons./ Hons. with Research) programme with Single Major and 3-Year Bachelor's degree in Multidisciplinary Studies under CCFUP, 2023-24 **within Four (04) consecutive academic years including the year of passing** the qualifying examination.
2. Candidate must have passed in **Four (04) recognized subjects (excluding Environmental Education/ Studies) including one language subject in the qualifying examination**. If the subject "Environmental Education/ Studies" is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.
3. Students who have passed Higher Secondary or equivalent examination with minimum **45% marks in the Aggregate** (to be calculated by adding the marks obtained in 'Best Four' subjects (excluding Environmental Education/ Studies) including only one language subject along with pass in the subject/related subject **or 50% marks in the subject or related subject** are eligible to apply for admission in the Honours/ Honours with Research programmes.
4. Students **carrying pass marks in Higher Secondary (10+2)** or equivalent examination with **pass in Four subjects (excluding Environmental Studies) including one language subject** are eligible to apply for Multidisciplinary programmes under CCFUP.
5. Candidate passing Higher Secondary Examination (10+2) from **Vocational stream** conducted by the respective Board/ Council for vocational studies or any other equivalent board/council are eligible for admission **within Four (04) consecutive academic sessions** including the year of passing the qualifying examination in the undergraduate programmes in **Multidisciplinary Studies only** subject to fulfillment of other criteria.
6. All admission to the 1st Semester of the undergraduate programme of studies is subject to Merit calculation and availability of seats in a particular 'Major Subject' for 4-Year Honours/ Research programme and seats available in a particular field of multidisciplinary studies for 3-Year Multidisciplinary programmes.

7. All admission processes to First Semester in the affiliated Degree Colleges shall be completed according to the guidelines of the Government of West Bengal and/or Academic Calendar of each Academic year of Vidyasagar University as applicable from time to time.

B. Other UG admission criteria:

i. Admission is to be done on merit basis and merit point for admission in **4-Year Bachelor's programme** with Honours is to be calculated by **adding 10% of total marks obtained in the 'Best Four' subjects (excluding Environment Studies) including one language subject** at Higher Secondary / Equivalent examination **and the marks obtained in the subject or related subject in which the admission in honours course is sought.**

ii. Merit point for admission in **3-Year Bachelor's in Multidisciplinary Studies** is to be calculated by **adding the marks obtained in 'Best Four' subjects (excluding Environment Studies) including one language subject** at Higher Secondary / Equivalent examination.

iii. **Tie-Break rules:** For students with same merit points the following rules to be considered

a) For 4-Year Honours/Research programme:

Tie-Break 1: Marks in Honours subject or related Subject (out of 100) in 10+2 level Exam.

Tie-Break 2: Percentage of Marks in 10th Level Exam.

b) For 3-Year Multidisciplinary programme:

Tie-Break 1: Marks of best scored Subject (out of 100) in 10+2 level Exam.

Tie-Break 2: Percentage of Marks in 10th Level Exam.

iv. If any student of Science stream in Higher Secondary /equivalent examination applies for Honours in Bengali /English /Hindi, his /her merit point is to be calculated proportionately by deducting marks obtained in the practical examination.

v. In addition to clause (i), any candidate seeking admission with Economics (Hons.) or Accounting & Finance (Hons.) or Marketing Management (Hons.) must have obtained 45% marks in Mathematics in Madhyamik (10th level) /equivalent examination or must have passed in Mathematics in Higher Secondary / equivalent examination. However, for Accounting & Finance (Hons.) this condition is not applicable for a student passing H.S. examination /equivalent examination having at least two Commerce papers one of which must be either Business Economics including Business Mathematics or Accountancy or any other equivalent subjects.

vi. In addition to clause (i) any candidate seeking admission with Physics (Hons.) must have passed in Mathematics in Higher Secondary /equivalent examination.

vii. Any candidate seeking admission in Lab based subjects must have obtained pass marks in those subjects /relevant subjects in H.S. level.

REGISTRATION

After admission every student is required to get himself/herself registered with the Vidyasagar University with the subjects taken in as per UG Guidelines. Without Registration the candidature of the admitted students will be cancelled.

EXAMINATION PATTERN

The following are the University examination patterns for these courses.

There are two way of assessment in each semester.

- **Internal Assessment (IA):** 20% marks of the each paper will be evaluated by the corresponding department in each semester. These marks will be evaluated based on two internal assessment and class attendance. Here 5 marks are assigned to each paper for class attendance and remaining for internal assessment.
- **2nd Semester Examination (ESE):** This is the final examination; a candidate has to appear to the prescribed centre by the university at the end of the semester. 80% marks of the any paper will be evaluated in this examination.

At the time of result publication these two marks will be combined and that will be converted to the Semester Grade point (SGPA).

SGPA: Semester Grade point average (SGPA) is evaluated after each semester. This will be computed in each semester as per the following formula:

$$SGPA = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^n C_i G_i}{\sum_{i=1}^n C_i}$$

C_i = The number of credits allotted for particular course.

G_i = This is the Grade points corresponding to the grade awarded for the course.

$i = 1, 2, \dots, n$ represent the number of course in which a student is registered in the concerned semester. The SGPA is rounded off to two decimal places.

CGPA: Cumulative Grade point average (CGPA) is evaluated after all semester. This will be computed in each semester as per the following formula:

$$CGPA = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^n C_i S_i}{\sum_{i=1}^n C_i}$$

C_i = The total credits of the corresponding semesters.

S_i = The SGPA of the corresponding semesters.

$i = 1, 2, \dots, n$ represent the number of the course in which a student is registered in the concerned semester. The CGPA is rounded off to two decimal places.

ACADEMIC BANK OF CREDIT (ABC)

The Academic Bank of Credit, a national-level facility, is a prime attribute in NEP for imparting flexibility to the curriculum framework and interdisciplinary/ multidisciplinary academic mobility of students across the higher education institutions (HEIs) in the country with an appropriate "credit transfer" mechanism. It is a mechanism to facilitate the students to choose their own learning path to attain a degree/diploma/certificate, working on the principle of multiple entry and exit as well as anytime anywhere, and any level of learning.

The multiple entries and exit options through ABC for students are facilitated at the undergraduate levels. It would facilitate credit accumulation through the facility created by the ABC scheme in the "Academic Bank Account" opened for students across the country to transfer and consolidate their credits by undergoing courses in any eligible Higher Education Institutes (HEIs).

Vidyasagar University offering multiple entries and exit system is registered in the ABC platform to enable credit transfer" and credit acceptance. The ABC allows for credit redemption by commuting the accrued credits in the Academic Bank Account maintained in the ABC to fulfill the credits requirements for awarding certificate/diploma/degree by the University. Upon collecting a certificate, diploma or degree, all the credits earned till then, in respect of that Certificate or degree, shall be debited from the account concerned. The validity of credits earned will be for a maximum period of **Seven Years for undergraduate level at the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC)**. The procedure for depositing credits earned, its shelf-life, the redemption of credits would be as per UGC.

GENERAL COLLEGE RULES

- Tuition fees for each month must be paid within 10th of the respective month, otherwise a fine Rs. 5/ will be charged for each month.
- Caution money will be refunded after a student completes the course (3 Years 6 Semester CBCS course) on production of the caution money receipt. If the caution money is not withdrawn within 3 months of passing out, it will be forfeited automatically.
- Students shall have to pay any fee omitted here or imposed later on by the college.
- Students must be punctual and regular in attending classes.
- Students must consult the College Notice board every day, failing which the College authority will not be responsible for any inconvenience faced by them
- Students are required to attend all extra-curricular activities organized by the institution.

DISCIPLINE

- Admission to the college binds a student to observe college rules and all directives that may be issued from time to time by College authority.
- Loitering and lounging in the corridors before the office and the library is strictly prohibited.
- Students must not unnecessarily assemble before the Principal's Room, Staff Room, Office, Library Room and Class rooms.
- Students must also regularly see the college Notice Board for various information.
- The students of 1st semester must fill in the University Registration form (availability of form will be notified on the notice board) positively within otherwise the college will bear no responsibility in this regard.
- Students must attend more than 75% lectures delivered in each subject. If a student does not attend 60% of lectures delivered, he will become discollegiate i.e. shall become ineligible to appear at the University Examination.
- Ragging in any form is prohibited in the college campus. If an incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain and if his explanations are not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him from the institution.
- Use of mobile phones inside the class-rooms is strictly prohibited.
- Disciplinary matters will be looked after by the Academic Subcommittee of the College
- Students shall take proper care of the college furniture and must not properly at its premises and must not spoil or cause any deliberate damage or tamper with the College property, furniture, fittings etc.
- Students shall leave their bicycles, scooters or motorcycle in the shed provided for this purpose. No bicycles, scooters or motorcycles shall be parked in any other part of the College premises.
- Passing improper comments about anybody and eve teasing of all forms are strictly prohibited.

IDENTITY CARD

After admission to the College each student is entitled to get an identity card signed by the Principal and it is a proof of his/her status as a student of this College. Students are required to bring their identity card with them to College and produce it as and when necessary. Loss of identity card must be reported immediately to the office and will be replaced on payment of charges for the same. In case of transfer or withdrawal from the college, the card must be surrendered at the College office.

LIBRARY

The library was established way back in the year 1964 with the inception of the college with some books mostly obtained through donations from the founder members. The library is now decorated with spacious shelving area, two separate reading rooms for students and teachers, a reference section and a server room. The whole library is secured with the CCTV surveillance. The library has a vast collection of both text books and reference books, print and online journals and newspapers which help in teaching and learning process of the faculty members and the students of our college. The library has a well designed website and online catalog (OPAC) which facilitates easy access to its collection. The students of 1st semester can apply for the library membership card after completion of their university registration. In case of 2nd and 3rd semester students, library card will be renewed after they are provisionally admitted to the college. All the students are required to bring one copy of their recent photographs (passport size) along with the fee receipt while applying for library membership. Students can borrow three books at a time for a period of fifteen days. A late fine of fifty paise per day will be levied after the due date. Students are requested to go through and abide by all the rules and regulations which are displayed at library notice board.

COMPLIANCE TO ANTI-RAGGING CELL

Students must submit an online affidavit regarding not to indulge in any kind of ragging through the portal www.antiragging.in. Students may report any kind of grievances to the college authority. There is an internal complaint cell in the college for redressing any kind of grievances of the student.

WOMEN CELL

We have also a women cell for empowering the female section of the college and also to look after them.

STIPEND, FREE STUDENTSHIP, SCHOLARSHIPS

Students Aid Fund

Student Welfare Committee provides some financial assistance to needy students during filling up of forms for University Examinations from their student – aid-fund. Student Welfare Committee invites applications from the students. Students are required to produce authenticated documents on Guardians income while applying for this aid. The financial assistance is provided to the poor students short-listed by the Student Welfare Committee upon verification of the documents. Stipend for SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B students:

Stipend for SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B

Students are awarded from the B.C.W. department. Students are required to collect forms from B.C.W. department, Jhargram and submit the duly filled in form to BCW Deptt, Jhargram after getting it verified from the college authorities.

Kanyashree:

Kanyashree Prakashya is a unique welfare scheme introduced by the Government of West Bengal which seeks to improve the status and wellbeing of girls, especially those from socio-economically disadvantaged families through Conditional Cash Transfers. The cash transfer is provided by the Department of Women & Child Development and Social Welfare, Government of West Bengal.

Aikyashree

Aikyashree scholarship is provided by the West Bengal Minorities Development and Finance Corporation (WBMDFC) for the meritorious students belonging to the minority communities (Buddhists, Christians, Jains, Muslims, Parsis, and Sikhs) coming from low income backgrounds of West Bengal.

Nabanna

Nabanna scholarship seeks to provide financial assistance to meritorious students of West Bengal every year under the Chief Minister's Relief Fund. It is provided by the Government of West Bengal for students who have cleared their Matriculation, Higher Secondary or any University (either UG/PG) Examination.

Sitaram Jindal Scholarship

Sitaram Jindal Scholarship is provided by the Sitaram Jindal Foundation—a charitable organization in Bangalore—every year to the meritorious and economically weak students all over India. Among others, students pursuing graduation can voluntarily apply for the scholarship.

Priyambada-Birla

The Priyamvada Birla Scholarship is funded by the Madhav Prasad Priyamvada Birla Apex Charitable Trust. The scholarship is meant for meritorious students from low income backgrounds pursuing undergraduate courses in recognized colleges and institutions in West Bengal.

Swami Vivekananda Merit cum Means Scholarship

Swami Vivekananda Merit cum Means Scholarship is provided by the Government of West Bengal for assisting the meritorious students belonging to economically backward families. Among others, the scholarship is open for students pursuing undergraduate courses in regular mode. Apart from the above scholarships, meritorious students coming from economically weaker backgrounds can apply for the national scholarship through the National Scholarship Portal as well as minority scholarships. Our college provides active help-desk facilities to the enrolled students willing to apply for all the above scholarships.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The NSS units of V.S. Mahavidyalaya have started their journey in the early 90's and have remained very successful in pursuing its activities till now. College has four N.S.S. units with four program officers as their monitoring heads. NATIONAL CADET CORPS (N.C.C.)

N.C.C. Companies for Boys and Girls of the college are under 25 Bengal Bn N.C.C. One A.N.O is in-charge of this Unit. Students are required to apply in prescribed form for enrolment as NCC cadet in the 1st year class and get the enrolment renewed in the 2nd year and 3rd year classes. The basic aim of N.C.C is to develop leadership qualities, sense of discipline, sense of devotion for national and social cause etc.

N.C.C. Unit of the college is one of the best in the state. Our cadets have made their presence felt at State and National levels and have already won 06 Governors medals.

N.C.C. cadets get chance to participate in number of activities such as camps at different parts of the country, expeditions to inculcate the spirit of adventure, Republic Day parades in Kolkata and New Delhi. State and

Central Governments give a number of incentives to N.C.C. cadets both in academic and employment fronts. N.C.C cadets having 'C' Certificates are given preference by Armed forces, B.S.F, C.R.P.F, C.I.S.F, I.T.B.P., West Bengal Police etc. during their recruitment process and many of our cadets have joined these forces from this institution.

Students are therefore advised to join N.C.C. as cadet and develop the skills required to face the challenges lying ahead with confidence.

FACILITIES

COLLEGE HEALTH CARE UNIT

College has a health care unit to regularly check-up the health of the students. College provided FIRST AID treatment to the students. The Health Unit organizes several health camps, awareness campaigns, etc. periodically in the college campus. There is a primary Health Centre within 2 Km from our place. We refer students if necessary.

HOSTEL

There are two separate hostels of this college, one for Boys and other for Girls.

Boys' Hostel

The college Boys' Hostel is offered to the meritorious and poor students according to the distance to the college from their home. The students need to apply for the Hostel at the time of admission. The students can continue after renewal of their candidature every semester. It is compulsory for all students to vacate their hostel seats after completion of the course. This period will not be extended under any circumstances.

Girls' Hostel

Girls' Hostel is meant for regular female students of this college. Boarders must obey the rules and regulations which the Principal of the college or the Superintendent of the hostel may enforce from time to time. The students need to apply for the Hostel at the time of admission. The students can continue after renewal of their candidature every semester. It is compulsory for all students to vacate their hostel seats after completion of the course. This period will not be extended under any circumstances.

Hostel Admission Criteria

Regular students of V.S. Mahavidyalaya are eligible for admission to these hostels. Admission will be for a full university session/semester. Application for admission to the hostel should be submitted to the college/hostel office in a prescribed form within a fixed date, to be notified by college/hostel office. Admission to the hostel as boarder is strictly done on the basis of distance and merit. Each application should be accompanied by-

- i. Certificates of good conduct from the superintendant of hostel last resided/ from the Head of the institution last attended/ a respectable person of the locality.
- ii. Self attested copy of the mark sheet of the last examination passed.
- iii. Distance certificate from M. L. A./Gram Panchayet/ S. D. O./ B. D. O./ Chairman of Municipality.
- iv. ST students can avail accommodation at Central boys ST hostel for which they will have to apply directly to B.C.W.D. at Jhargram.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

Students leaving the college after successful completion of their studies are required to enroll their names in the college alumni association and extend their helping hand for the development of the institution.

REMEDIAL COACHING CLASSES

Earlier there was a provision of Remedial Coaching for the S.C. / S.T. / O.B.C. students of the College with financial assistance from U.G.C. Since the year 2009, students from General category were also allowed to benefit from this scheme. Although this scheme is currently not operational due to lack of financial assistance from UGC, our teachers, on their own initiative, organize remedial classes for the slow learners and also for those who need to clear their back papers.

CAREER COUNSELING CELL

College has a career counselling cell being run with financial assistance from U.G.C. It provides information and guidance regarding the future career planning of the students. Lately, it has facilitated the initiation of three value added courses and enrolment of more than 400 students in those courses provided under the Utkarsh Bangla initiative of the Government of West Bengal. Moreover, the career counselling cell has a significant track record of organizing occasional seminars and workshops for motivating the students and providing the much required guidance in their areas of interest.

PERIODICAL PARENT-TEACHER MEET

A parent-teacher meeting is a short meeting that takes place in a regular interval usually after every semester between the parents and teachers of the concerned departments to discuss the progress and find solutions to academic or behavioral problems of a student. Feedback from the parents are taken for improvements in academic services.
